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Public Library Statistics 2009/10 Executive Summary

All NSW local government authorities (councils) have adopted the *Library Act 1939*, and of these all but one provides public library services to their communities.

In 2009/10 there were 99 library services, including stand alone libraries and regional or joint libraries where up to eight local councils have entered into a written agreement to provide combined services.

In addition to the 98 central libraries there were 276[#] branch libraries. There were also 68 deposit stations/other service outlets, 37 administration/specialist service points and 23 mobile libraries operated by the central libraries, providing services to remote and isolated communities.

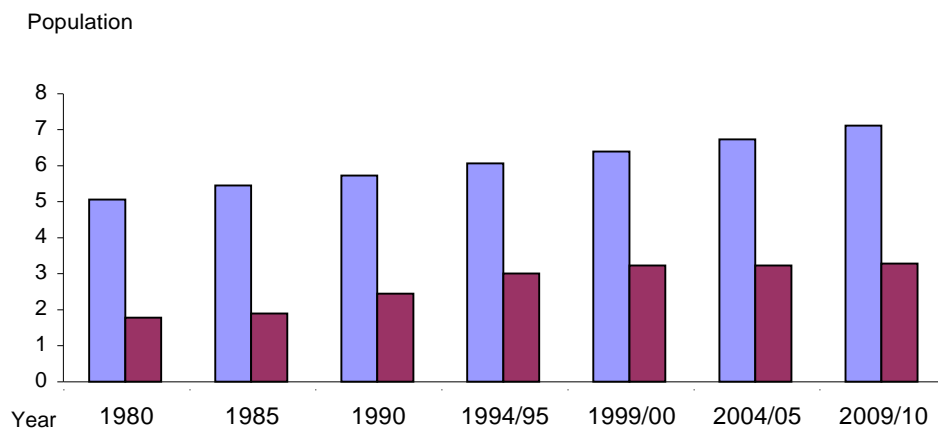
NSW public library statistical measures have been gathered, collated and published by the State Library of New South Wales since 1973, producing a significant body of material for comparative purposes. This issue of *Public Library Statistics* has been produced from the reports provided to the State Library of New South Wales by local councils for the period July 2009 to June 2010.

A comparison of a number of measures collected over the last 30 years demonstrates the ongoing evolution of local public library services in New South Wales. A selection of graphs and tables demonstrating these developments follows.

BORROWERS AS A PERCENTAGE OF POPULATION

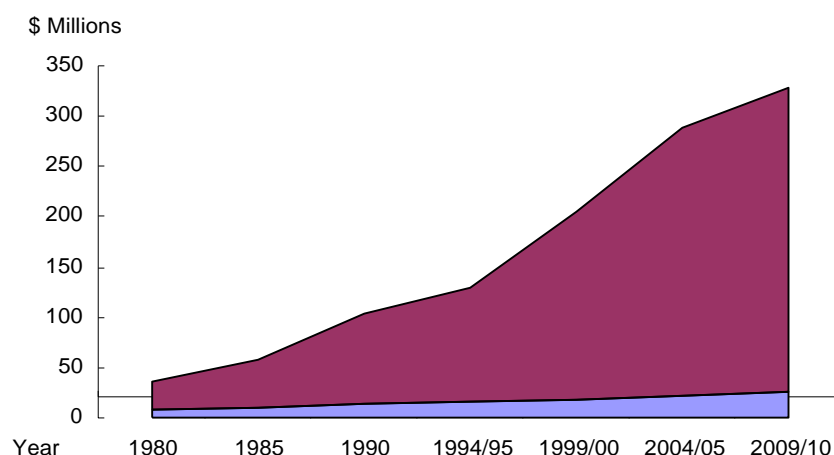

Borrowers are those members of the community who have joined their local public library and hold a membership card. Membership records are maintained on computer databases and these records are updated every two years. Therefore, the increase in membership over the twenty years, from 35% in 1980 to 46% in 2009/10, has been accurately tracked.

It is important to note that many more people use public libraries than are registered members. Numerous clients consult the reference collection, read newspapers and journals, use a computer, research local history, or use the Internet, but do not borrow materials to take home.

EXPENDITURE ON PUBLIC LIBRARY SERVICES



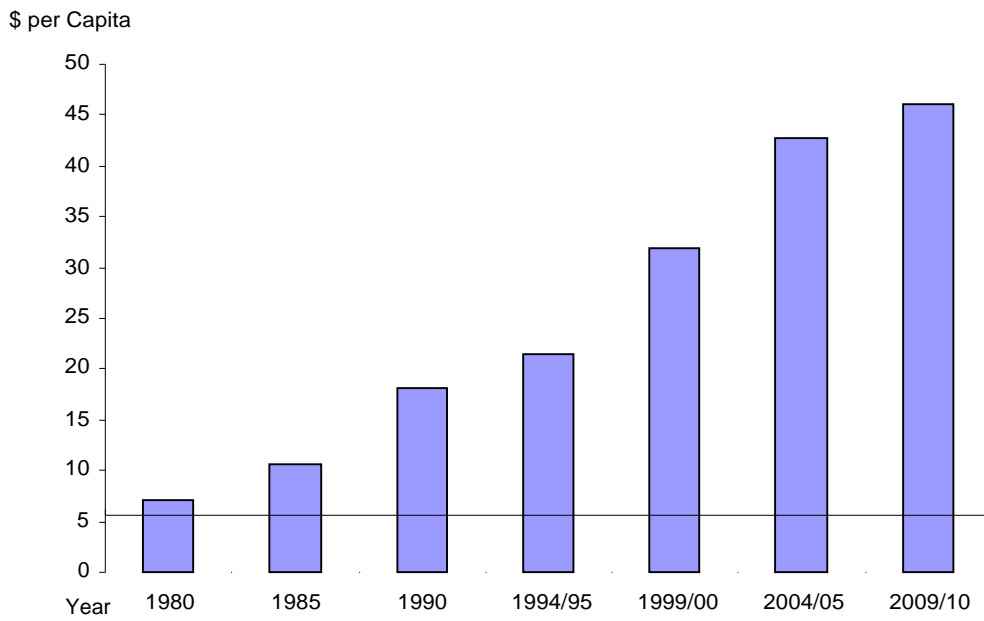
The graph above records the investment of Local and State Government in public library services for the people of New South Wales.

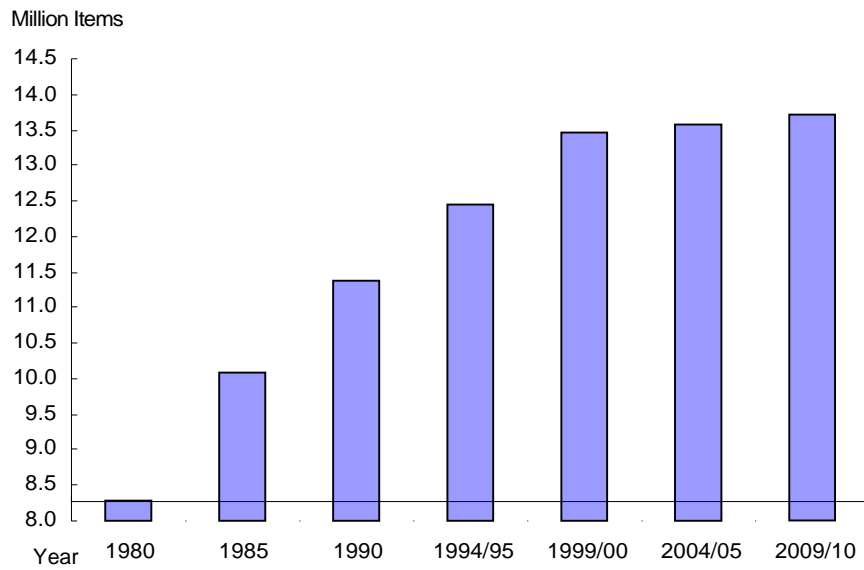

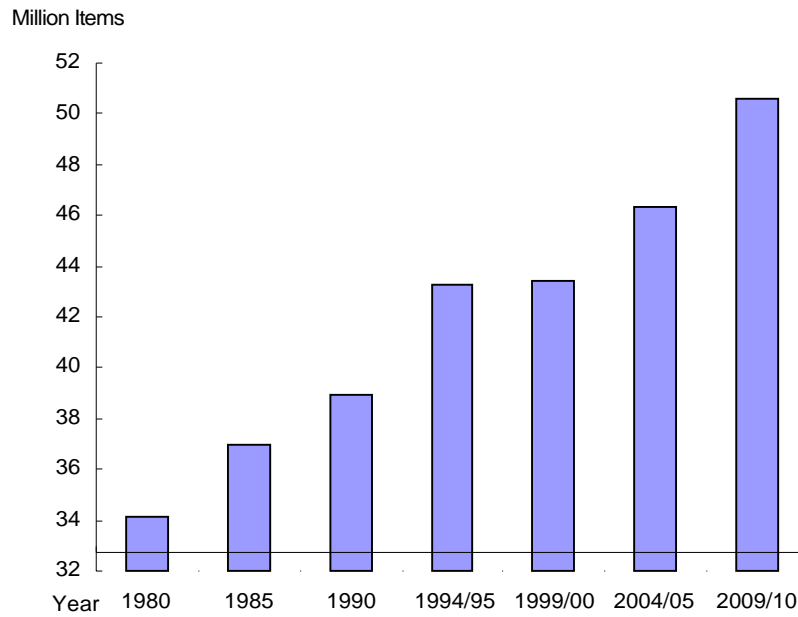
LIBRARY MATERIALS HELD BY NSW PUBLIC LIBRARIES

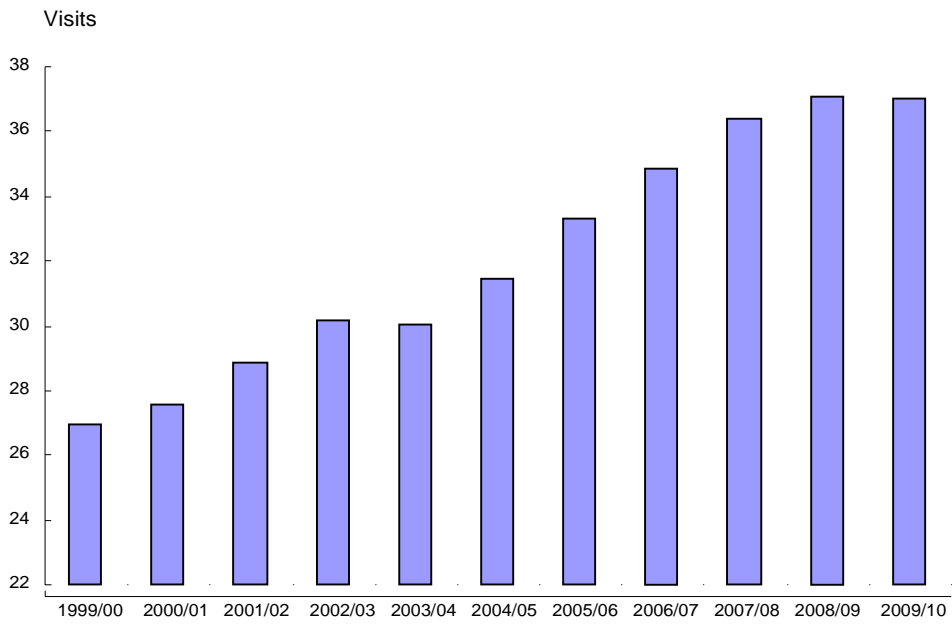

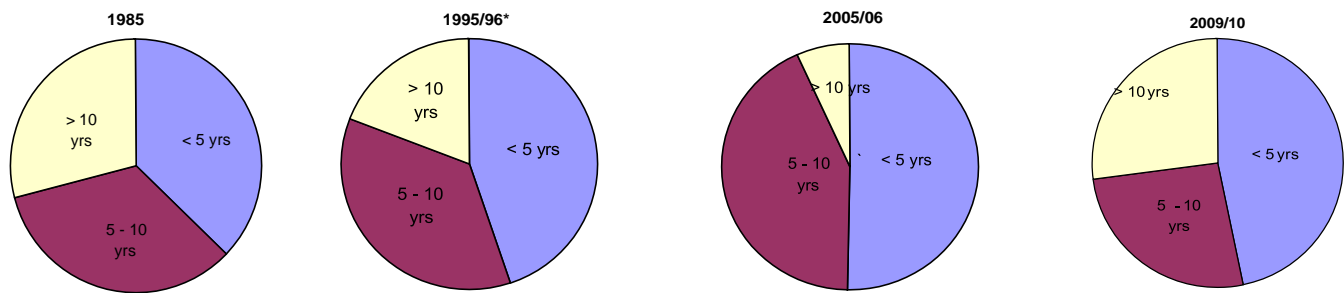

How current are collections in local libraries?

In 1985, 70.85% of library materials in New South Wales public libraries were less than 10 years old and 37.36% less than five years old.

By 1995/96, 80.72% were less than 10.5 years old and 44.85% less than 5.5 years old.

In 2005/06, 93.31% were less than 10 years old and 50.23% less than five years old.

In 2009/10, 72.75% were less than 10 years old and 46.64% less than five years old.

Data on the age of collection from 1985 - 2007/08 was calculated by comparing the total number of items purchased over the last 5 years and the last 10 years with the total current stock.

**From 2008/09 the methodology used to calculate the age of material was revised to improve accuracy of the data collected in this area. The data presented in Age of Library Material is now based on the number of items purchased in the last 5 years and the last 10 years according to the date the material was acquired by the library as reported by the library's Library Management System.

Significant changes between 2008/09 and previous years can be attributed to these changes in methodology and the availability of more accurate data.

* Notes: The 1995/96 pie chart uses 5.5 and 10.5 years in the calculations as the extraordinary six month period of January–June 1994 had to be factored into the equations when local government changed from a calendar to a fiscal year.

The pie charts were calculated from the information provided by the libraries and not all libraries reported age of bookstock.

Notes to Public Library Statistics

Disclaimer

While every care is taken in collating and compiling the data for *Public Library Statistics* the submissions are not re-checked in detail for accuracy and there may be inconsistencies.

This report of statistical measures for public libraries in New South Wales has been produced from the 2009/10 statistical return reports provided to the State Library by local councils. It covers the period July 2009 to June 2010. The tables show increased use of public library services in New South Wales over the twelve-month period.

The 2009/10 statistics are based on data submitted as at 30 June 2010 with per capita calculation worked out using population figures for June 2009.

Public Library Statistics has been published since 1973, providing significant historic time lines for comparative purposes.

Council Amalgamations and/or Boundary Changes

This section details all amalgamations and/or boundary changes that have affected NSW local government authorities (councils) since 1999/00. Over this period the number of authorities has decreased from 177 to 152.

Categories

Up to 1994/95 library services were categorised as 'metropolitan' or 'country' in line with the categories assigned to local authorities by the NSW Local Government Grants Commission. This categorisation was based on two variables: geographic location and size of urban centre. For further details see the introduction to the 1994/95 *Public Library Statistics*.

By 1995/96 the need for comparative analysis of Australian local governments on a national basis had been recognised and the **Australian Classification of Local Governments** was adopted by the NSW Local Government Grants Commission. The national system uses population, population density, population growth, and location to identify twenty-two categories of local government in Australia as detailed below. This classification system has been used in *Public Library Statistics* from 1995/96.

The *Expenditure and Subsidy* table on **pages 2-4** uses the Australian Classification categories instead of the earlier NSW Local Government Grants Commission categories. For the purposes of this report the council statistics in the *Expenditure and Subsidy by Councils* table on **page 9** are divided into the seven main categories of Capital City (CC), Urban Metropolitan Developed (D) Urban Regional Town/City (R), Urban Fringe (F), Rural Significant Growth (SG), Rural Agricultural (A), and Rural Remote (T).

Tables: Explanatory Notes

Some of the tables relate to a council, (eg. annual expenditure), whilst others relate to the library service, whether that be a stand alone library, or a library service operated by more than one council.

Table 1 Expenditure and Subsidy: by Councils

The total expenditure figures provided by councils include monies from all sources spent on the library service for that year. This figure, therefore, includes subsidy and Library Development Grants where applicable, as well as the contribution made by local government. The total expenditure figure is the gross expenditure, not the net expenditure.

A new column was added last year showing Operating Expenditure per Capita. This data was previously reported by the Department of Local Government and published in the Comparative Information on NSW Local Government Councils.

The expenditure figure for July 2010-June 2011 (Table 1a) represents the total **voted** by councils for library services in this period. This figure may vary when the actual expenditure figures for this period are known. The subsidy figures in this table do not include funds from the Library Development Grants. Details of the Library Development Grant funds allocated in each year are listed in the *Annual Report of the Library Council of New South Wales*.

Table 1 Expenditure and Subsidy & 1a Voted Expenditure, Subsidy and Local Priority Grant

All NSW councils which provide a library service in accordance with the Library Act 1939 receive a Subsidy and Disability & Geographic Adjustment payment in support of their library (see p. xxii). Councils allocate at least 30% of their Disability & Geographic Adjustment payment to a library project, termed their "Local Priority Grant". These payments are reported in tables 1 and 1a as follows: "Subsidy" comprises the per capita prescribed amount plus the portion of the Disability and Geographic Adjustment which is not allocated to the Local Priority Grant. The "Local Priority Grant" is the amount nominated by each council for its Local Priority Grant project.

Table 1d Expenditure on Library Material: By Library Service

This table lists the breakdown of expenditure on library material; it includes licensed access to electronic resources.

Table 2e Circulation by Council

This table lists circulation and circulation per capita by council. This data was previously reported by the Department of Local Government and published in the Comparative Information on NSW Local Government Councils. Please note that the Victorian Councils party to the Upper Murray Regional Library are **not** included in this table.

Table 4a Non-Resident Members by Council

This table lists non-resident members by council. Please note that the Victorian Councils party to the Upper Murray Regional Library are **not** included in this table.

Table 5 Service Points

A *Service Point* refers to the building, not the number of information or service desks within the building.

A *Central Library* is either a single site library service point, or the operational centre and central service point of a multiple site library service; is operated by permanent paid library staff; is usually where the principal library collections are housed; processing is centralised; AND where the public have direct access to a full range of library services and facilities. Unless otherwise specified the main branch library of the Administering Council of a Regional Library service is taken as the Central Library

An *Administration Headquarters* is the operational centre for a multiple site library service that operates only or mainly for administrative functions and does not provide a full range of public library services. This is not counted as the Central Library but as an *Administration Specialist Service Point*.

A *Branch Library* is a *service point* that is an auxiliary facility with separate quarters from the Central Library, a permanent collection of books, permanent paid staff present during all hours of opening, offers a broad range of public library services and a regular schedule of public service hours.

A *Specialist Service Point* is a facility with public access that does not offer a broad range of public library services, but focuses on one aspect of public library service, eg. children's, genealogy. It is operated by permanent paid library staff present during all hours of opening. This is not counted as a Branch Library but as a *Specialist Service Point*.

Public Service Outlets primarily cover Deposit Stations and are usually staffed by volunteers, or have no staff.

Public Service Outlets - Deposit Station – a service point not operated by library staff, usually open limited hours and stocked with a small collection of books and other library materials that are changed periodically. Computer access to the library's database may also be provided. Bulk loans to institutions eg. Nursing homes, retirement villages, schools are not Deposit Stations.

Public Service Outlets –Other – These service points may be operated by paid library staff but are open less than ten hours a week.

A *Joint Use Facility* or *Area* is open to the public, has a permanent paid staff and is managed by a formal cooperative agreement between the council and another institution (usually educational, eg. school). A *Joint Use Facility* normally functions as a branch library, eg. a school/public library whilst a *Joint Use Area* functions within a library, eg. a Telecentre.

A *Mobile Library* is a vehicle equipped and operated by paid library staff to provide a mobile branch library service.

Table 5 Hours of Opening

Hours of opening count the number of hours a library is open to the community.

Hours of opening are not counted twice for any service point that covers more than one function.
